Actor Rahul Nath is reportedly at ease with his latest project 'Compromise' which shows his character go through a series of disturbing events, which also include a man on man rape. Actor Rahul Nath broke free from the sweet, boy-next-door image with his portrayal of a closeted doctor in 'Foreign', in which he has won multiple awards in India. But it looks like he is all set to take it a step further now. Rahul, who spent months preparing to play an emotionally broken down guy in his upcoming film 'Compromise' has apparently done his entire homework thoroughly before he started shooting for the film earlier on this year.

The actor, who even had been bold in his interviews about the movie, has always maintained that he wants to take on a roles that challenge him and advance him further in his career as an actor . He had earlier said, "I love controversy attached to everything I do when it comes to acting. I can't play the sweet boy anymore, I have to have something to really get my teeth into ". Rahul, who has never really been boxed

as a certain type of actor, apparently has pulled out all of the stops in

'Compromise', giving a performance that will surely be praised and remembered .

And Rahul surprisingly, for the first time, too has praise for his work, a rare compliment seen by the actor.

Besides shedding weight for the role and losing sleep, he also had another difficult task at hand. Rahul, say sources, had to



shoot two very demanding scenes, one of which involved him being a raped victim, something which the actor had to work on before the camera rolled. A source says, "He knew what he was getting into, right from the time the film had been given the green signal. He knew that playing this role meant that it was a role that required him to shed his inhibitions and take his career to the next level " The source adds that in order to make sure that he didn't get cold feet while shooting, Rahul had rehearsed with is co actors much in advance. "He and his co actors spent a huge amount of time rehearsing those demanding scenes, so that when the shoot was in place, the scene was well rehearsed and no actor was uncomfortable with what was going on. This helped him get comfortable and into the skin of the character to a great extent." And it looks like all the hard work has helped him. A recent screening in Mumbai , has had the press superglue themselves to Rahul, generating the curiosity of what the actor is going to dish out next. And with talks with Rahul now merging with critical cinemas golden director, Shyam Benegal , the buzz is again surely buzzing around the name Rahul Nath
